

2.1.1 ELITA Inaugural Talk








2.1.4 Workshop on Research Methodology




2.2.b.2 Intercollegiate Elocution Competition





2.4.1 Grassroots I @



As part of the social responsibility initiatives taken by the Department for building supportive communities through Extension program, *Grassroots I* was organised. *Grassroots* saw the extension of *Namaste English* by reorienting the extension education by blending the transference of English language skills with community service goals. Government Model Residential School, Ettumanoor was chosen for the same as the school caters to the Tribal Girls. The students were encouraged to think about how they can put to use the knowledge they have amassed from the institution for the benefit of the society at large.15 student volunteers charted out their activities, inspirational talks, and menstrual hygiene awareness programmes. They were also briefed about Human rights observance and how knowing one's rights and affirming one's rights should be prioritised. The principal Dr. Jagandini and Superintendent Ms. Anju were of immense help in the conduct of the programme. Dr. Viju Kurian and Dr. Kavitha Gopalakrishnan accompanied the students to the school. 64 students of Model Residential School participated in the programme.







2.4.2 Grassroots II

8 students from both UG and PG participated in the program. The Department was able to hand over a small contribution of Rs. 2540/- to the Trust.



















2.5.1 Upskill- A Skill Development Workshop


2.5.2 Career Orientation


2.5.3 The Edge- Competitive Exam Orientation

Mr. Allen had shared his experience of Manga reading. The three speakers explained their topics with illustrated powerpoint slides. The session was an enriching experience to the listeners. 46 students participated in the session.



2.5.5 Discourse

The Department of English organizes the activities of Discourse with the intention of encouraging the creative skills of students, and to exhibit, perform, discuss, and debate the texts brought forth by them. The session conducted this year focused on literary writing. Students who wrote poetry were identified and a discussion session was held to recite and exchange their perspectives on their poems. Students were very keen to meet the authors and to interact with them. The session was conducted on January 23, 2023 at the Department Library at 3.00 pm. Poets, Anagha Mahesh (I MA English), Ms. Aswati (II MA English), and Ms. Seethal Elsa Mathew (II MA English) recited and shared their perspectives on the poems. 
2.8.6 RootEd- Handwritten Creative Magazine themed "For a sustainable tomorrow"



2.8.7 Movers & Shakers- Ruminations on Theory by Postgraduate Students & Teachers


