PROGRAMMES ORGANISED

The Department Association for the year 2018-'19 was inaugurated on 14th August 2018 at College Auditorium. A Health Camp was conducted in association with the Inauguration, with the help and support of the District Hospital, Kottayam. Ms. Mini,

the Dietitian, inaugurated the camp with a brief awareness class on the importance of nutrition. It was followed by health check-ups and eye testing. More than 250 individuals, including students, teaching staff and non-teaching staff were benefited with the Health camp.

- An Expo on Nutrition Awareness was organised by the Department of Zoology in association with the Department of Botany, as per the order of the Department of Health, Government of Kerala, on 3rd August 2018. The expo was mainly focused on the nutrition that the food we eat in our everyday life provide us. It also aimed at the ill effects of Junk food as well as the balanced diet and its importance. The expo was inaugurated at 11.30 am by our respected principal Dr. Jancey Thomas. It comprised different stalls put up by students under different heads like calories, water, vitamins, green leaves, junk foods etc and also a food stall by the students of the Department of Botany.
- Freshers' Day was conducted by the students of D2 and D3 Zoology classes to give a warm welcome to D1 students on 29th September 2018. Various Entertainment Programme for developing a rapport between students of all the three classes of the Department.
- The Department of Zoology launched a Butterfly garden in the college campus as a new ecofriendly venture on 12th October, 2018. A few students were assigned duty to brought saplings of various larval and adult food plants (host plants) from Tropical Institute of Ecological Sciences (TIES), Velloor, Kottayam and Mr. Sarath, ecologist from TIES guided the students to plant the saplings in correct location of the garden area. This new endeavor helps to familiarize the students about the life cycle and specific host plants of various butterflies. Also it brings a pleasant ambience in the college campus.

The third edition of Department Fest, Ashwamedha – 'ASHWAMEDHA 3.0' was held in our campus day 16th February 2019. The event was inaugurated by Prof. C. M. Mathew Sir [founder HOD of Zoology Dept.], our Chief Guest of the day, by lighting the lamp followed by a key note address. The trophy of the fest is been titled by the name of Prof. C. M. Mathew. 43 students from various colleges participated in the fest. The events in the Fest included Spot Choreography, Quiz, Spotter Identification, Hand Painting, Treasure Hunt, Beg Borrow Buy and Craft Making. Reviews were collected from the participants during valediction. The winners of each event were awarded with the certificates and cash prizes. C.M.S College Kottayam lifted the Prof. C. M. Mathew ever rolling trophy by bagging the maximum points. Thus the successful conduct of **Ashwamedha 3.0** was done.

DETAILED REPORTS

NUTRITION EXPO

A nutrition expo was organised by the Department of Zoology in association with the Department of Botany, as per the order of the Department of Health, Government of Kerala, on 3rd August 2018. The expo was mainly focused on the nutrition that the food we eat in our everyday life provide us. It also aimed at the ill effects of Junk food as well as the balanced diet and its importance. The expo was inaugurated at 11.30 am by our respected principal Dr. Jancey Thomas.



Students put up mainly 6 stalls including a food stall. The remaining 5 stalls mainly focused on the nutrition required for a human body. The 5 stalls were:

- 1) Calories
- 2) Vitamins
- 3) Water
- 4) Green leaves
- 5) Junk food

Calories

The group mainly aimed at promoting awareness on the calorific value of food we eat in our everyday lives. They demonstrated how each type of food gets absorbed by the human body and which parts of the human body gets benefited from these foods. They



gave an idea on the calories a person must acquire by eating breakfast, lunch and dinner. The group also succeeded in providing information about the best time to eat. The group also succeeded in providing samples of edible as well as calorie rich food items.

Vitamins

The group aimed at showing the relevance of Vitamins in our daily diet. With the help of charts they showed the types of fruits, vegetables and other edible substances which comes under different types of vitamins i.e Vitamin A,B,C,D,E,K etc. They provided information on both water soluble as well as fat soluble vitamins and provided samples of food items rich in Vitamins such as milk, meat, egg, fish and other types of fruits and vegetables.

<u>Water</u>

Water, as we know, is one of the most important requirements for the proper functioning of human body. The group mainly aimed at the importance of water in maintaining a healthy life style and its irreplaceable part in digestion. They gave information on the amount of water one must drink everyday and according to the age group. They also



demonstrated the difference between hard water and soft water and also showed which is best to drink.

Green leaves

The group targeted at the importance of leafy vegetables in our food habit. They demonstrated how green leaves play an important role in the balanced diet plan of an individual. They also gave information on the importance of spices like cinnamon, cardamom etc. in the food and also the importance of leafy vegetables in our balanced diet.





They provided samples of pulses and cereals which must be included in the diet and gave a brief description of their importance.

Junk food

The group mainly aimed at giving awareness on the ill effects caused by the overdependence on junk food. They mainly focused on the food items like chocolates, snacks such as pizza, burger etc and soft drinks. The group at first demonstrated how the covers of chocolate itself provide information on the artificial sweeteners and other components added to it. They also gave a brief description on how it mainly affects the body parts especially tooth. The group then gave awareness on the hazardous side of snacks and food items like porotta, pizza, burgers and sandwiches. As a conclusion they demonstrated the poisonous effects of soft drinks such as Pepsi by showing the changes it cause to human teeth and an iron nail after immersed into it.



A food stall was put up by the students of the Dtepartment of Botany. The stall provided nutrient rich food items and was one of the huge attractions of the event.

ASSOCIATION INAUGURATION AND HEALTH CAMP

The Department Association for the year 2018-'19 was inaugurated on 14th August 2018 at College Auditorium. A Health Camp was conducted in association with the Inauguration, with the help and support of the District Hospital, Kottayam. The whole hearted cooperation of Ophthalmology and Dietetics Departments of the hospital were extended for the camp. Ms. Mini, the Dietitian, inaugurated the camp with a brief awareness class on the importance of nutrition. It was followed by health check-ups and eye testing. The health-checkup reports of each beneficiary were then analysed and suggestions based on the report were given by the dietitian to follow a healthy diet. Eye testing was co-ordinated by Ms. Sreekala, the optometrist. More than 250 individuals, including students, teaching staff and non-teaching staff were benefited with the Medical camp. The camp held from 10.30 a.m. to 3 p.m. and it was found a grant success.

A few students of D1 class were assigned duty for watering and manuring the plants. Close monitoring of the developments in the garden is

regularly done by the staff and students of the Department. Various stages of life cycle of different butterfly species were observed on specific host plants in the garden. This new endeavor is very beneficial to the students of the department who are interested in biodiversity studies for their curriculum based project

work. Also it brings a pleasant ambience in the college campus.

STUDY TOUR 2018-'19

The tour of D3 Zoology for the year 2018-19 was conducted for three days starting from 16th January, 2019. The first day of the tour was strictly academics oriented. The journey began at 5.00 a.m. on 14th January and all 32

students along with 2 teachers and a lab assistant comprised the tour party. The first destination was Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI), Ernakulum. The students got an opportunity to learn about the marine biodiversity as well as various methods on conserving the diversity. The institute provided demonstration sessions on electron microscopy and processing of food fishes. The students were shown aquariums with marine fishes and a museum with preserved specimens ranging from sponges to higher animals. Small lectures were given on topics like, 'How pearl is secreted by an oyster', as well as a detailed lecture with samples on how to determine the age of a fish. Later, the students had some leisure time at Marine drive. They were taken into the open sea in a cruise boat with a dance floor.

The next destination was Chikmaglur and the group reached there on the morning of January 15th morning and checked in to Hotel Raj Mahal Orchid. After breakfast the students along with the teachers and staff were taken for a jeep trekking into the Chikmaglur hills. On the way the group halted at several scenic spots taking in the mesmerizing beauty of the hills.

On 16th January morning the group started to Belur, the next destination. After spending some time at the Belur temple, the group left to Coorg. The students were taken for river rafting and they spent an hour in the lake.
