#### Introduction

Baselius College, Kottayam, Kerala was established in the year 1964 by a galaxy of eminent men to fulfill the long cherished dream of the Malankara Orthodox Christian Community to dedicate themselves to the service of God and man. This premier postgraduate institution that flourished from the precincts of the MD Seminary High School was founded to perpetuate the sacred memory of our heavenly patron His Holiness Baselios Geevarghese, the late lamented Catholicos of the East, who steered the destiny of the Orthodox Church with grace and vision for more than three decades. The college was brought under the Educational Agency of the Malankara Orthodox Church Colleges in 1979. The college was accredited by the NAAC at the three star level in 2000 and Reaccredited with B<sup>++</sup> level in 2007. The college campus is declared "Eco-friendly", hence use of non biodegradable materials are restricted on the Campus. The college promotes rainwater harvesting programme. There is huge Ferro Cement tank to harvest rainwater on the campus. The college provides generators and inverters to meet times of power failure. The library is fully automated with LAN and free internet facilities in all departments. The most ambitious projects like Women's hostel, Language lab, spacious computer labs with computers and internet facility, and Bioinformatics Lab will become a reality by the assistance of UGC. ICT is promoted by each department. The campus is made vibrant by several co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The faculty and students make optimum use of the Information and Communication Technology. The full fledged Computer Centre and Multimedia and Audiovisual Centre facilitate basic training to the students, and has made a conscious effort to invest in the hardware and train the faculty in documentation and data processing. A well equipped Language Laboratory with the latest software helps in strengthening communication skill, and personality development.

Plan of action chalked out in the beginning of the year (2010-2011) towards quality enhancement.

• Fostering Global Competencies and enhancing academic excellence.

In order to foster global competencies and academic excellence among the students, the following plans were chalked out:

- \* To conduct national and state level workshops and seminars in the PG and UG Departments.
- \* To accommodate students in UGC sponsored Add on Courses in 'Travel and Tourism;' in the Department of Commerce, and 'Communication Skills' in the Department of English.
- Addressing the environmental and societal issues.
  - \* To conduct seminars, workshops and awareness programmes in order to sensitize students about the global environmental problems.
  - \* To strengthen the activities of National Service Scheme and Nature Club.
  - \* The Red Ribbon Club is functioning in this college in close association with our NSS units. Its main objective is to sensitize students regarding the need for voluntary blood donation. Side by side, it also helps create awareness regarding diseases such as HIV / Aids, Hepatitis B etc which are mainly spread through infected blood, casual and unprotected sexual contact etc. Our Red Ribbon Club unit arranges mass blood

donation programmes on selected dates, accepting blood from all willing students and staff. It also arranges blood for medical emergencies reported from neighbouring hospitals. Every year, on World Aids Day (December 1<sup>st</sup>), there will be special awareness programmes under the auspices of the RRC.

## • Creating balanced Personality in students

- \* To provide orientation programmes and value education classes to the students to improve their self awareness, motivation and mental hygiene.
- \* To organize health programmes like yoga and Aerobics to improve health and physical fitness of the students by the Physical Education Department.
- \* To set up health monitoring programmes in the Department of Zoology and under the auspices of the National Service Scheme.

## • Promoting the use of Technology

- \* Purchase more licensed computer software.
- \* Internet facility to be made available in all Departments and to establish networking.
- \* General informatics training programme for teachers and students.
- \* Strengthening the Multimedia and online radio established in the campus.

#### • Infrastructure Augmentation

- \* Renovation of Chemistry, Physics and Zoology laboratories.
- \* Purchase of more computers for all departments.
- \* Enhance learning facilities for the students, in keeping with the changed CBCSS Curriculum addition of laboratory equipments and instruments to the science laboratories.
- \* Complete college campus beautification programme.

# 2. New Academic Programmes Initiated (UG and PG):

No new programmes were initiated during the year. (We applied, but the Govt. / University didn't sanction any new programme).

#### New Academic Programmes initiated: Other than UG/PG

In order to strive for quality enhancement, a few programmes other than UG and PG were initiated. The newly introduced CBCSS UG curriculum was in the second year, covering 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> semesters, the first batch. The Chairpersons and members of Board of studies from this college, namely Dr. Susan Panicker (Chairperson, BOS, Zoology UG), Prof. N.V. Leela (Chairperson, BOS, Syriac UG), Dr. Biju Thomas (Member, BOS, Physical education UG), Prof. Joshua George (Chairperson, BOS, Political Science), Dr. Annie Cherian (Member, BOS, Statistics) were doing their level best in the curricular design and transaction according to the directions of the university, higher education council and the feedback from students and teachers.
