A legend in theoretical & experimental Physics, He took his M.Sc from CUSAT, Kochi and Ph.D from IIT, Madras[1969 – 74], He was the first malayalee to have got Ph.D in Physics from IIT, Madras. He took his Post Doctoral from BARC Bombay.



He started his career as a Scientist in CSIR, RRL, TVM in the period 1976-78 under PK Rohatgi of MIT. There he carried out work on Aluminium fabrication, Steel graphitation, Research on Solar energy. There after he joined as a Lecturer in Calicut University and served there for 8 Years [1978-86]. Then in 1986-87, he became the in Calicut University. There after he joined M G University in 1987 as a reader.



He has held positions as a Syndicate member of MGU, Senate member of CUSAT, Dean of Applied Sciences, MGU, Director of SPAP, MGU, Member of Academic Council, MGU, Director of Computer Center, MGU, Director of Student Services, MGU.



His area of interest is in theoretical Physics- On Lattice Dynamics and in Experimental Physics- Thin Film.



He also has guided students in Medical Science and Shape memory alloys. He has over 200 in International Journal publications and Over 300 paper presentations in conferences. He has produced 45 Ph.Ds.

He is the Immediate Past President of IPS (Indian Psychatry Society)- Kerala State Chapter, Convener of IPS Task Force on Patients' Rights. (Past Hon Gen Secretary of IPS Kerala, Past Hon Editor of Kerala Journal of Psychiatry, Past Associate Editor of Indian Journal of Social Psychiatry, National Asst Secretary of IPS)



Apart from several scientific publications in international and national publications, he has authored chapters in textbooks on social psychiatry and IPS text book for undergraduates. Also writes extensively n media on various issues concerning mental health. He has published books and handbooks in local language on Mental Health in general and Depression and Suicide Prevention in particular.

Prof. C.T. Aravindakumar, Pro Vice Chancellor, M G University with his vast experience in research was called upon to take two topics. The first one was on "Learn how to review a journal article'. These topics were taken for second year mentees. The session started at 10:00 am at Mrs. Mammen Mappilla Hall.

Prof. C.T. Aravindakumar received B.Sc. degree in chemistry from University of Kerala in 1986 (D.B. College, Sasthamcotta). A national level fellowship (NCL-Pune University) brought him to University of Pune for doing M.Sc. in 1986. He completed M.Sc. in 1988 and joined for Ph.D. at the same year. The Ph.D. thesis work with the title, Radiation Chemical Studies of Some DNA Model Systems, is an interdisciplinary topic which has relevance in chemistry, biology and environment (under the guidance of Prof. B.S.M. Rao). This involved extensive use of Pulse Radiolysis. The programme was completed in collaboration with the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC), Mumbai (with Padma Shri Prof.J.P. Mittal and Dr.Harimohan) and the Max-Planck-Institute (MPI) fuer Strahlenchemie, Muelheim a.d. Ruhr, Germany (with Prof.von Sonntag). He was the recipient of ICSC-World Laboratory (Switzerland) fellowship to work at the MPI, Germany, as part of the Ph.D programme. During this tenure, he also collaborated with Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Mumbai, for experiments on Laser-EPR for radical detection. Immediately after his Ph.D. from University of Pune, he joined as a Lecturer at the School of Chemical Sciences of Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, in 1993



Later he joined the Division of Biochemistry of Katholieke Universities Leuven, Belgium for post-doctoral research in 1997 to work on a two year programme. Another post-doctoral fellowship from Max-Planck-Society brought him back to Max-Plank-Institute f. Strahlenchemie in 2000 (with Prof. Von Sonntag). He also worked as a Visiting Faculty for one year at the Department of Biophysics of Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, The Netherlands in 2001 (with Prof. Rienk van Grundelle and Prof. Herbert van Amerongen). He joined as a Professor at the School of Environmental Sciences of Mahatma Gandhi University in 2010. He was the Dean of Faculty of Environmental and Atmospheric Sciences of Mahatma Gandhi University. Presently he holds the post as the Pro Vice Chancellor of M.G University.

His research interests in the last two decades have been in radiation chemistry, environmental chemistry, radiation biology and photochemistry. He is also a constant reviewer of many international journals in environmental science, Chemistry and biology.



Besides his research activities, he has interest in environmental education, environmental policies and governance, and music (sitar).

Prof. C.T. Aravindakumar, is an environmentalist by profession and so he was the best person anybody could think of for taking the topic environment sensitisation. The class was beautifully timed and well organized.
