- Hand over the suggestions received relating to syllabus and curriculum to the
 Board which will be drafting the revised curriculum. The draft syllabus document
 was also examined by teachers of the department. Department Heads will be
 directed to communicate the suggestions directly to the authorities. Thrust shall
 be given to the suggestions of industrialists and employers as the recent
 developments in the market have to be considered.
- Departments were asked to orient the students to visit the website of the college
 and get an idea regarding the various academic aspects including the plan of
 action. They shall be directed to go through the academic and examination
 calendars given in the handbook so that curriculum delivery is carried out as per
 plans.
- It was also decided to counsel students regarding the examination patterns and timings of the university. Students are found to remark that the derailment of the examination schedules create a lot of tension and pressure. Tutors and mentors

shall address the issue during the sessions. Similarly, departments where the curriculum rating is given a low score by the students shall discuss the matter with the students and arrange enrichment sessions.

- Departments shall organise Industrial Visits and Field Trips to areas relevant to the discipline.
- The concerns raised by teachers regarding difficulty to cover the portions on account of shortage of semester time shall be addressed in the Workshops convened for the restructuring of curriculum. All departments shall ensure that teachers actively participate in the workshops and share the opinion.
- It was also decided to offer venue for restructuring workshops at the college itself.
- It was decided to start discussions on the outcomes of the courses and programme in the light of OBE framework.
- At the time of revisions, when new electives are offered, departments may choose electives having more demand and employability.
- Research shall be given more importance and workshops shall be organised for P G
 Students as suggested by Alumni. Similarly, possibilities of offering professional course training shall be considered.

Subsequent Implementation of the actions suggested

- ✓ Teachers participated in the curriculum revision workshops organised by the University.
- ✓ Two members of Faculty Council Dr. Jyothimol P and Sri Manoj Narayanan K S took active role in the drafting of the new syllabi of U G programmes. The concerns raised by the various stakeholders were communicated to the authorities through them in the meetings.
- ✓ The college was the venue for syllabus revisions workshops of two disciplines-(1) Commerce (2) Management
- ✓ Department s arranged filed trips and also curriculum enrichment lecture.
- ✓ New Certificate Courses leading to Skill Development were introduced-Microsoft Office Specialist

- ✓ The College signed and MOU with the Institute of Company Secretaries of India and started a study centre for Company Secretary Course.
- ✓ Research Methodology related workshops were arranged under the aegis of research promotion Council.
- \checkmark New elective was chosen for B Com Model III- Self Financing.

- Organise programmes relating to areas like Intellectual Property rights and start new Add on/ Certificate Programmes
- As a part of participative learning and student research, departments were asked to arrange programmes
- Teachers shall provide more e-contents to the students.

• Student and Teacher Exchange programmes may be planned in academics and research.

- More thrust shall be given for experiential learning.
- Based on suggestions, lectures and activities shall be arranged relating to values, gender sensitisation etc.

Subsequent Implementation of the actions suggested


- ✓ Special sessions were held for advanced and slow learners
- ✓ A new Diploma programme in Logistics and Supply Chain management was started in 2018.
- ✓ A new certificate course in Python was started in 2018.
- ✓ Sessions of research methodology was arranged for UG and PG students.
- ✓ The newly established IPR Cell arranged programmes on Intellectual Property Rights.
- ✓ Student Seminars were organised by the departments of Commerce, English etc.
- ✓ Collaborative Seminars and Lectures were arranged. Areas covered include GST, Emerging areas like Nano technology, International Accounting and Finance, Digital Marketing, Paris Agreement and Climate Change etc. Departments collaborated with M G University, Kendra Sahithya academy, other academic institutions etc.

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✓ Students from other colleges were permitted to carry research in M.Sc.

Physics and M Phil Physics as part of Student Exchange for research.

✓ Erudite lectures and session on Gender Equity, Human Rights,
Sustainable Development were arranged.

- P G students shall be provided with more Industrial Visits and Filed trips as their feedback on experiential learning opportunities present a lower score
- Remedial and extra sessions shall be provided to the departments with lower score in case of semester time being felt as too short for coverage of syllabus.
- Teachers shall be given training in the development of Econtents.
- Programmes may be organised to develop the innovative thinking as the employers have remarked that the curriculum does not provide such an opportunity.
- Based on employer feedback, it was suggested that departments may start skill based certificate courses so

that the issues of less skill components and innovative thinking in the syllabus can be overcome.

- Students shall be encouraged to give more presentations.
- Career Guidance and Placement Cell shall be entrusted to explore the possibility of starting classes for PSC and other competitive examinations.
- Departments were asked to hold discussions with stakeholders and give necessary suggestions at the time of Syllabus revision workshops of Postgraduate Programmes.

Subsequent Implementation of the actions suggested

- ✓ Industrial Visits were organised, especially for P G students to Special Economic Zone. Similarly study tours and field trips were conducted to Rubber Research Institute, Padayani etc.
- ✓ New Certificate Programmes were launched in creative Thinking, Theatre Studies, Food Processing, Agri-based Enterprises, Applied Skill in Zoology. These programmes are intended to develop creative thinking, skills and innovation among students.
- ✓ Training for PSC examinations was started.
- ✓ Departments conducted Student Seminar Competitions and power point presentations was encouraged.
- \checkmark Training Sessions were arranged by IQAC for teachers in connection with E-content development.
- ✓ Teachers of P G Departments participated in the P G Syllabus and Curriculum revision workshop very actively.

 The Board of Studies members took lead role in the syllabus

drafting. The college also acted as a venue for the Restructuring Workshop of M.Com.

 \checkmark Academic Sessions were organised by the departments in connection with the newly implemented P g syllabus.

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- Extra sessions shall be provided for students for covering the portions considering the lesser number of working days available than envisaged.
- Programmes relating to Entrepreneurship Development and Interactions with Entrepreneurs, Top Officials etc. shall be organised by the Departments and ED Clubs.
- Students shall be provided with e-contents and blended learning shall be encouraged.
- Novelty shall be thought of while conducting class tests etc.
- Students shall be encouraged to pursue online courses too.
- Departments shall arrange special sessions and webinars relating to recent developments in the topic.

- All clubs and subject associations shall organise and arrange events helpful for enrichment of curriculum.
- Departments shall set the outcomes of next semesters of the new syllabus of P G Programmes. Similarly sessions relating to new P G syllabus shall be organised.

Subsequent Implementation of the actions suggested - 2019-20

- ✓ Many sessions for entrepreneurship development and interactive sessions were arranged. The BBA department started a Talk Series titled 'Let's Talk Business'. The E D Club arranged interactive lecture series with leading and budding entrepreneurs.
- ✓ The students participated in programmes like YIP to present their ideas.
- ✓ Online sessions and webinars were arranged by the departments regarding various areas of developments.
- ✓ Certificate Programmes were offered in online mode.
- ✓ Students also completed online courses and also undertook online internship.
- ✓ Certificate Course in data Analysis was launched.

The Curriculum committee evaluated the feedbacks from various stakeholders and took the following decisions:

- Based on feedback of PG students, it was decided to explore the possibility of inclusion of add on/certificate courses.
- Departments were directed to analyse the outcome attainments when the final results are declared and the consolidated result sheets are received.
- Teachers shall also communicate to the Board of Studies regarding issues faced in completion of portions within the stipulated time frame. This is a common issue pointed out by teachers and students.
- The feedback of U G students presents a reasonably good score for curriculum, its planning and delivery. Inclusion of filed visits can be thought of only after there are relaxations of restrictions. However,

students may be motivated by the departments for joining online internship to gain work knowledge.

- More training and orientation sessions shall be arranged for the benefit of students.
- Blended learning shall be encouraged, especially as the pandemic situation prevails.

Subsequent Implementation of the actions suggested

- ✓ Blended learning is being encouraged, especially when there are restrictions on physical gatherings.
- ✓ Sessions relating to entrepreneurship are being conducted on a routine basis. The chance of interacting with different types of entrepreneurs is found to motivate students.
- ✓ Some students pursue internship in online mode.
- ✓ Departments have arranged seminars/talks/lectures, with special emphasis on the revised P G syllabus.
- ✓ Sessions on recent areas like data analytics have been arranged
