## 1. World Environment Day

The National Service Scheme volunteers observed World Environment Day on 06/06/2016 by planting saplings in the campus. The college Principal, Sri.Alexander V. George inaugurated the programme by planting saplings. Dr.Sindu Jones, Dr. Nalini. J along with the Programme Officers, Ms. Arabhi P. and Mr. Thomas Kuruvilla joined hands in planting saplings. In addition to this, the NSS volunteers cleaned the public space in front of the college. A garden too, is maintained there by our college. A total of 20 students participated in the event.



## 2. Ancient Computational Techniques in Mathematics

1. The Association of Mathematics flagged off its activities on 17th June, 2016 with the inauguration of the first class of the 'Vedic Mathematics' Lecture Series. Sri. P. Devaraj from Ramanuja Sarani, spoke on the topic "Exploring Indian Contribution in Mathematics". Dr. Annie Cherian welcomed the gathering and the principal, Prof. Alexander V. George presided over the meeting. The three hour class began at 10.30 am and was held at the Educational Technology Seminar Hall. The class was extremely beneficial for the students as it helped them to get awareness about the renowned Indian Mathematicians and their major contributions in the field of Mathematics. The programme ended by 1.30 pm. 40 students participated.



2. The second lecture series of Vedic Mathematics led by Sri P. Devaraj, was conducted on July 1st, 2016 at 2.00 pm at the Educational Seminar Room. The class was on "Fundamentals of Vedic Mathematics & its Application-I." Fundamentals of Vedic Mathematics were explained and different techniques in doing fundamental arithmetic operations were also shown by Sri. P. Devaraj during this session. This enhanced the student's skill in doing arithmetic operations especially, multiplication of large numbers within a short time. It also helped the students to boost their thinking capability and memory. The program was wound up by 4.30 pm. Ms Anumol T.A delivered the vote of thanks.



### **3. International Yoga Day**

International Yoga Day was commemorated in the college on 21/06/2016, in collaboration with National Service Scheme and Mahatma Gandhi University-Centre for Yoga and Naturopathy. 300 students and programme officers from various colleges performed yoga. M.G. University Vice Chancellor Dr Babu Sebastian, Honorary Director of Centre for Yoga and Naturopathy, Dr C.R.Harilakshmindra Kumar, M.G.University NSS Programme Coordinator, Dr. K. Sabukuttan, Baselius College principal, Mr. Alexander V. George and Baselius College programme officers too performed yoga. The event was inaugurated by M.G University Vice Chancellor Dr. Babu Sebastian. Yoga performance was led by yoga master Sanjayan and Ms.Anjana.



#### 4. Clean, Green Medical College

Navajeevan Trust, Kottayam, Clean and Green Association, along with the NSS volunteers of our college, cleaned the compound of Kottayam Medical College and planted several tree saplings on 02/07/2016. The Programme Officers and thirty volunteers, reached Medical College at 10.30 am and engaged in the cleaning activities as per the instructions received from the Navajeevan Trust members. Inspired by this initiative, many onlookers too joined the volunteers. The participation of the public in the cleansing activities helped create an effective awareness among the public about the significance and need of maintaining clean and healthy premises. 30 students participated.



### **5. Seminar on “Indian Railway”**

On 13th of July 2016, a seminar on ‘INDIAN RAILWAY’ was conducted and N.S.S volunteers from the college attended the seminar which began at 2.00 in the evening. Seminar was given by station master M.T Salem. After the seminar the volunteers along with volunteers from other colleges and railway employees together cleaned the compound of railway health centre till 4.00 in the evening. A total of 30 students participated in this event.

### **6. Special Coaching for Numerical Ability to School Children**

The extension activity of the Mathematics Association was the orientation programme on “Ancient Indian Mathematics”, crafted for school students. Teachers from the department introduced various concepts and techniques to students and later 15 students from D1, D2 and D3 Mathematics had extended it for students in Government Model High School, from July to

November 2016, in order to augment the arithmetic skills of school students. They shared information about the origin and the evolution of maths and how it was interpreted and used in various civilizations. A total of 15 students participated in the event. It helped the students not only to know more about history of Mathematics but it also enhanced their numerical skills.



## 7. Love Kottayam - Law Literacy Programme

The NSS members also participated in the training class held on 06/08/2016 at BCM college auditorium, in connection with the 'LOVE KOTTAYAM' [Legal Orientation vision for Exemplary Kottayam] project implemented in collaboration with District Legal Services Authority Kottayam, National Service Scheme, Mahatma Gandhi University, and BAR Association, Kottayam. This project with the motto 'Laws are not to fear, but to protect us', has been launched with the intention of making the public familiar with the laws in our country and how the law can protect us and to make the public aware that they can approach the body of law without fear. The formal meeting was inaugurated by Adv. S. Santhakumar (District & sessions court judge). Sessions were taken by Sub. Judge A. Ijas, Adv. Akhil Kumar and Adv. Sindhu Gopalakrishnan. Then videos on the topic were screened. Meanwhile booklets were also distributed. The programme concluded by 2.00pm and 8 NSS volunteers of Basilius College, participated in the event.





### **8. 'Share and Care Foundation' For the Heart Surgery of Child**




## 10. My Face




### **24. One Day Class By Students of MA English**

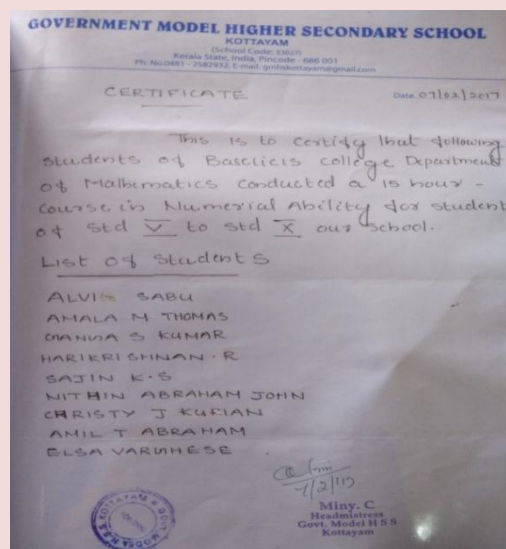

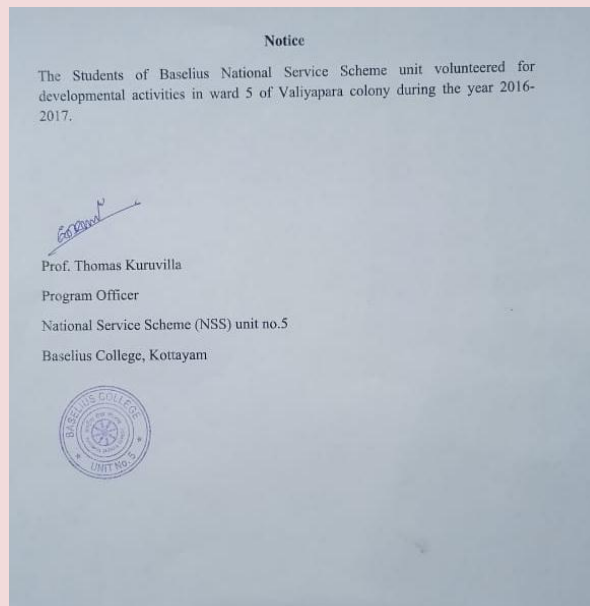
### 30. Snehaveedu

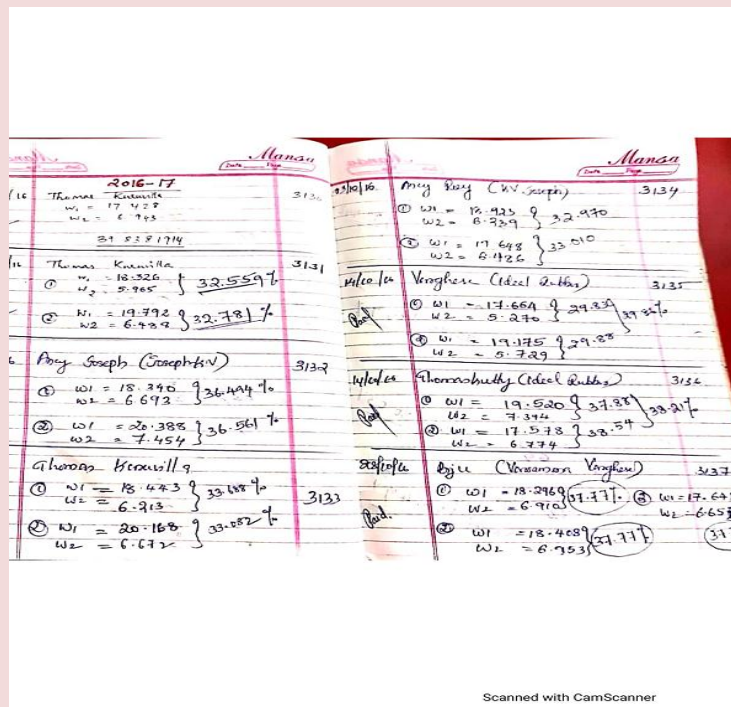


### 32. Pothichoru

‘Pothichoru’, a programme of distributing lunch to the people in the street. Every Friday volunteers distributed about 50 food packets throughout the Kottayam town. Food packets and money for the food packets were collected from the students. All the students actively contributed to this initiative. Under this initiative more than 750 food packets were distributed to the needy during 2016-17.10 volunteers took the initiative of coordination and distribution of packets collected .

### 33. Dry Rubber Content Testing

A Dry rubber content testing was arranged by the Department of Botany. Dry rubber content testing helps public to get maximum prize to latex in open market. The department of botany generated Rs. 4540 after charging Rs. 35/ per sample. A total of 3 students participated in the program.
