

### 1. World Bicycle Day







# 2. World Environment Day









#### 3. World Ocean Day





#### 6. World Blood Donor Day



# 8. International Yoga Day







#### 9. International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking




# 10. National Doctor's Day












# 11. World Population Day






#### 12. National Youth Skills


### 15. Kargil Vijay Divas








#### 18. Hiroshima Day


Seven decades back, the world witnessed its first ever atomic bombing when the United States detonated a nuclear bomb over the Japanese city of Hiroshima, a major hub of industrial and military activities in the country. The bombing that happened around 8:15 am on August 6, 1945, killed 1.4 lakh people by the end of that year, including those who perished from radiation exposure after the blast.

The impact of the blast was such that 80,000 people died instantly while tens of thousands more lost their lives to the effects of radiation within the months and years that followed, wiping 39 per cent of the city's total population. Hiroshima day is observed on August 6 to commemorate the atomic bombing of Hiroshima ,Japan in 1945, at the end of World War II.On August 6th, the Hiroshima day memorial service is held to commemorate the victims of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima. The service is celebrated in many countes around the world, and it is an important event in the history of Hiroshima.

#### 20. World Organ Donor Day




#### 21. Indepedence Day









#### 22. World Photography Day







#### 42. Republic Day









#### 43. Martyr's Day






## 46. International Day of Action for River








### 2. World Youth Skill Day




# 3. Teacher's Day


#### 10. Hiroshima Observance Day


# 13. Pi Approximation Day









### 15. World Environment Day



As a part of imparting environmental awareness to society, we distributed environment awareness booklets to our Principal, Vice Principal, teachers, non teaching staff and students of our college.




### Programme 3: Cleaning of botanical garden and Planting of trees (07.06.2022)


## **Programme 6: Thoolikapetty Rewamping (09.06.2022)**








### 22. World's Sea Turtle Day

# 23. International Tiger Day




#### 24. World Elephant Day


# 25. National Science Day




# 26. Chartered Accountants Day/ GST Day








# 27. International Yoga Day








#### 35. International Drug Abuse Day
