
Overall, World Blood Donor Day serves as a reminder of the critical need for safe blood donations and the profound impact that donors can have on the lives of patients in need of transfusions.

The Pulwama attack refers to a tragic incident that occurred on February 14, 2019, in the Pulwama district of Jammu and Kashmir, India. A convoy of vehicles carrying Indian security personnel was targeted by a suicide bomber affiliated with the militant group Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM). The attack resulted in the deaths of 40 Indian Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel and the injuring of many others.

The attack sparked outrage and condemnation both within India and internationally. India accused Pakistan of providing support and shelter to the militant group responsible for the attack, JeM, which operates from Pakistani territory. In response, India conducted airstrikes against alleged JeM training camps in Pakistan- administered Kashmir.

The Pulwama attack escalated tensions between India and Pakistan, leading to a significan military standoff between the two nuclear-armed neighbors. The international community urged both countries to exercise restraint and engage in dialogue to de-escalate the situation.

The Pulwama attack has had far-reaching implications for the security dynamics in the region and has underscored the persistent challenges posed by terrorism and cross-border violence in the Kashmir region.




6. Hiroshima and Nagasaki Day Observance






#### 13.World Wetland Day
